REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON JULY 7, 2009

**READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:**

**DEPT. HEAD REPORTS:**

Police Chief, Kyle Bawks announced National Night Out on August 4<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm. He informed Council about NIXLE.com which will be a free website for Perry residents to get local information. His department also received a \$1500 grant from the Hundred Club of Flint for Bulletproof vests.

DPW Supt., Chuck Mudge announced that his department has been jetting and vacuuming the sewer lines. They have completed the steps on the sledding hill and they will be flushing Fire Hydrants on Wednesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> & Thursday, the 23<sup>rd</sup> in the evenings.
